Most Old Order Amish speak Pennsylvania Dutch. According to one scholar "today, almost all Amish are functionally bilingual in Pennasylvania Dutch and English, however, domains of usage are sharply separated. Pennsylvania Dutch dominates in most in-group settings, such as the dinner table and preaching in church service. In contrast, English is used for most reading and writing interactions with non-Amish. They often speak German at school.
